The fee for a Farmers' Market vendor license is as follows:

- (1) The license fee for food establishments selling food and providing samples is \$20. Food items requiring license in this category would be: popcorn, kettle corn, coffee, tea, hot chocolate. Offering of these food products with real cream, milk or ice would require the higher license fee. salsa, salad dressing, cheese, bread, bread products, granola, pastries, cakes, cookies, beef jerky, summer sausage, prepackaged hummus, soup, salads.
- (2) The license fee for food establishments cooking foods meant to be eaten at the market such as tacos, crepes, tamales, ribs, sandwiches, etc. is \$187.50. Food items requiring license in this category would be: ribs, chicken, fish, burgers, hot dogs, sausages, tamales, tacos, burritos, breakfast foods, coffee or tea with cream, milk or ice, shaved ice, smoothies, ice cream.
