On December 4, 2021 a security incident occurred involving the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) information technology systems. Information about the incident can be found on the MDH webpage [Pages - Home \(maryland.gov\)](#). Out of an abundance of caution, MDH servers are currently offline. As a result, we are not able to enter new applications or retrieve license/permit renewal information at this time. This has delayed the processing of all new applications for licenses, plan reviews, and license/permit renewals. We are also unable to retrieve digital records, resulting in additional delays in fulfilling requests for inspection histories or statistical information.

This letter/email is to notify you that the Office of Food Protection has received your renewal application and payment. Please use this letter as proof of renewal. Please note:

Once the MDH network is restored all applications will be entered into the system and new licenses will be issued.

Section 10-226(b) of the State Government Article provides that licenses do not expire until a unit acts on a renewal application if the licensee submits a renewal application at least two calendar weeks before expiration. This means that anyone that is filing for a renewal, has been administratively extended as long as they filed their renewal application at least two weeks prior to their expiration.
